St. Xavier's School Doranda under the Banner of AROUSE (Animation Rural Outreach Service) an NGO run by Jesuit Society associated itself with the MDG's in 2007. In the year 2007 and 2008, there were international teachers seminar organized in Belgium and Senegal respectively in which three of our teachers took active part. After having attended the seminars teachers started teaching the said millennium development goals in the class room curriculum. In the first stage our students tried to promote these goals through "CARE AND SHARE" club to the students of neighboring schools, such as Sacred Heart, St. Francis, Loreto, St. Anthony etc. In the same year based on the goals Inter-schools debated competition was organized be St. Xavier's where as many as 17 schools took part. Thereafter our students were given the exposure program at two different places namely Rumtukel in Murhu Block and Sunderpur in Gumla District. They had regular visits at intervals to make people aware of Malaria and

saving the environment by planting trees. With these visits they interacted with

the villagers and explained them the said goals.

This year two of our students Anirban Dutta and Shivam Kumar along with

other students, are making headway in fulfilling these goals in a very concrete

manner. They had audio video presentation in BIT and through the news papers

they tried to reach as many people as possible. In Kahdi Mela recently concluded

along with their companions they presented a dance drama taking the theme of

maternal care, one of the goals. Again on 14th November on children's day our

boys are airing these goals in 92.7 F.M.

(April 10 - 17) to be held in Czech Republic in April 2010. The Participating

countries are Belgium, France, UK, Poland, Czech Republic, Senegal and India.
