- Provide a simple explanation of 'What are Articles?'
- Explain and clarify 'Consonant sounds' and 'Vowel sounds'.
- Specify the **general rules** for usage of Indefinite Articles.
- Explain **exceptional rules** for usage of 'Indefinite articles' (a / an).
 - # **A/a** is also used with words beginning with vowels (a, e, i, o, u) but which have a consonant (**yu**) sound or (wa) sound.

Examples

A uniform a European a unicorn a useful object a one-eyed cat(**yu**-uniform) (**yu**-ropean) (**yu**-nicorn) (**yu**-seful) (**wa**- eyed cat)# **An/an** is also used with words beginning with consonants such as '**h**', where it is silent.

Examples

An hour an honestboy an heirto the throne an honourableman

(h is silent in all the above underlined words)

Presentation

- Children will neatly draw a rainbow and colour it with the seven colours: violet, indigo, blue, green, yellow, orange and red.
- Each rainbow band will contain **two (2) 'words'**; **one word** that would require an **exceptional usage** of the **indefinite article 'a'** and the **other word** that would require an **exceptional usage** of the **indefinite article 'an'**.
- Children will **frame grammatically correct sentences, using appropriate 'articles'** with **each word** written in the bands.

Details of project

- 1) Definition of an angle.(Define an angle on the ruled side and draw on the blank side)

- 2) Make a flow chart on angles on the blank side of the page and write the names of all the angles on the ruled side.
- 3) Write the definition of each type of angle on the ruled side. On the white page draw the same angle. Below this draw or paste a clock and show the above angle formed between its two hands (as shown in the figure below.) Repeat the same for each type of angle in the consecutive pages.
